
REGISTRATION PROCESS

Step 1:

Choose 1.5 credits of electives.

Check our website for course descriptions and pre-requisites.

Clearly write course codes and course titles on registration form.

Step 2:

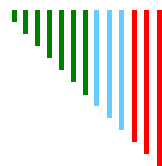
Decide if you want to take an Honors class. Honors courses are rigorous and require daily homework. If you are interested in Honors, see your middle school counselor for the **Honors Rigor Commitment Agreement**. Sign it and attach it to your registration form.

Step 3:

Get required signatures (see registration form). Math classes and Honors classes require teacher signature. Parent signature is needed for these too!

Step 4:

Turn form (with all required signatures) in to middle school counselor by **March 2nd!**

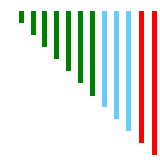

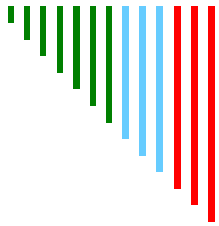

Nuts and Bolts of Mountlake Terrace High School

- Students typically take 6 classes per day.
- Classes are 50 minutes long and are worth .50 credit per semester.
- Most students are in school from 7:20-1:50.
- Some music classes are offered as "0" period (6:50). Journalism is "7th" period (2:00-2:50).
- Students have a half hour lunch; lunch is determined by the location of their 4th period class.
- We have a "closed campus". Students may go off campus for lunch in grades 10-12 if they have an "Off Campus Pass" available in the Attendance Office.
- Music students who are planning on taking four years of World Language are not required to take Digital Communications.

Honors:

MTHS is proud to offer several Honors classes to freshmen. Students may select Honors English 9, Honors Humanities 9, Honors Geometry, Honors Algebra 2, Honors Biology, and Honors World History 9. Students must sign the "Rigor Commitment Agreement" and obtain both parent and teacher approval. (See middle school counselor for the form).

Project Lead the Way— PLTW:

PLTW is a unique and rigorous program aimed at inspiring young people who have interests in problem-solving, design, and technology, as well as at preparing students for success in university programs in science and engineering, and in technology-driven careers. Freshmen interested in PLTW should sign up for "Intro to Engineering Design".

High School Graduation Requirements:

English:	4.0 credits
Math:	3.0 credits (through 2nd Year Alg)
Science:	2.0 credits
History:	3.5 credits
Career/Tech:	1.5 credits
Health:	0.5 credit
PE:	1.5 credits
Art:	1.0 credit
Sr. Experience	0.5 credit
Electives:	4.5 credits

Note: WA 4-year colleges and universities now require a quantitative -based class during the senior year (ex: 2nd Year Algebra or higher, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics).

Students are also required to:

- Complete a Culminating Project
- Pass High School Proficiency Exams in reading, writing, math, science
- Complete a "High School and Beyond Plan"
- Earn 22 credits
