REGISTRATION DATES:

In many classes enrollment is limited, so please register as soon as possible. **Courses with less than 20 students enrolled may be cancelled.** If a course is cancelled students may enroll in another class or receive a full refund. Please make note of course dates and times. Your receipt or cancelled check is confirmation of registration. You will receive no other notification. Class rosters and room numbers will be posted the first day of school.

GRADES:

In-district student grades are entered directly onto transcripts. Out-of-district student transcripts will be mailed to the school address on the registration form. All students receive grade sheets the final day of class (July 31, 2009). In-district student grades will not be mailed home.

TUITION:

\$200.00 – High School ½ Credit

\$150.00 – One Middle School Course

Please make check or money order payable to Edmonds School District No. 15. No refunds will be given should attendance or discipline cause a student to be withdrawn from summer school. Limited scholarship funds are available on a first come/first served basis to students who qualify. Amount: High School \$50, Middle School \$25.

Collection of Evidence Course Offerings

Math Collection of Evidence (COE 200)

This course is designed for any high school junior or senior who has not yet passed the math WASL. To earn a passing grade and credit for the course, students will develop a minimum of 8 work samples that can be used for a sufficient math Collection of Evidence (COE) that they will be able to submit next school year as an alternative to the math WASL. Students who complete this course will earn 1/2 math credit. (Pass/Fail)

Many Edmonds district students who have submitted math COEs have met the math standard through this approach.

Reading Collection of Evidence (COE 100)

This course is designed for any high school junior or senior who has attempted, but not yet passed the Reading WASL. The reading COE will consist of the reading samples that together demonstrate an understanding of the reading process and application of reading skills. Students will be able to submit their Reading COE next year as an alternative to the Reading WASL. Students who complete this course will earn 1/2 English credit. (Pass/Fail)

Writing Collection of Evidence (COE 101)

This course is designed for any high school junior or senior who has attempted, but not yet passed the Writing WASL. The Writing COE will consist of the student's 6 best writing samples that together demonstrate an understanding of the writing process. Students will be able to submit their Writing COE next year as an alternative to the Writing WASL. Students who complete this course will earn 1/2 English credit. (Pass/Fail)

Course Offerings

(For Credit Retrieval Only)*



The high school courses satisfy specific high school graduation requirements. Students successfully completing one-half credit courses will have received 60 hours of classroom instruction.

With the exception of ELL courses, summer school courses are intended for credit retrieval only.

*On a space available basis students may register for summer school for grade replacement with the approval of the secondary summer school principal.

MATH

Remedial Mathematics (DMA 100) – Grades 7-8

\$150.00 This course takes students at their appropriate level and moves individually through topics as students master one unit after another. (Not open to students who have passed Algebra 1/2.)

Algebra (MAT 202) – Grades 9-12

(½ Credit)-- \$200.00 This course is for students who have mastered basic computational skills. The course offers an opportunity to learn how to perform computations of real numbers, solve equations and inequalities, graph equations and inequalities, solve systems of equation, and apply equations in solving story problems.

Geometry (MAT 302) – Grades 9-12

(½ Credit)-- \$200.00 This course emphasizes deductive reasoning as well as studying lines, angles, triangles and circles. These are studied with respect to congruence, similarity, etc.

ELL (English Language Learners)

These classes are for in-district students only and tuition cost is covered by scholarships. There is a materials fee of \$25.00.

ELL Beginning I (ELL 092) – This class is for current ELL middle or high school students with limited English language skills. Enrollment is limited to 20 per class.

ELL Intermediate Read 180 (ELL 202) – An intensive reading and writing course utilizing READ 180. This class is for current ELL middle or high school students. Enrollment is limited to 20 per class.

ELL Advanced Read 180 (ELL 302) – An intensive reading and writing course utilizing READ 180. This class is for current ELL middle or high school students. Enrollment is limited to 20 per class.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Special Education English (ZEN 102/202/302/402) – Grades 9-12

(½ Credit)-- \$200.00 A structured reading class for struggling readers on an Individual Education Plan (IEP). Students who have participated in READ 180 during the school year or have reading as an identified deficit area are eligible to enroll. Courses with less than 13 students may be cancelled.

Special Education Math (ZMA 062) – Grades 9-12

(½ credit)-- \$200.00 For students who have math goals on their Individual Education Plans (IEPs). Courses with less than 13 students may be cancelled.

ENGLISH

English (DEN 700/800) – Grades 7-8

\$150.00 Geared to the individual's pace and needs. The course reviews grammar usage, punctuation, spelling, and the mechanics of the writing process.

English (ENG 102/202/302/402) – Grades 9-12

(½ Credit) -- \$200.00 These courses emphasize the fundamentals of writing, speaking and reading. (These courses satisfy graduation requirements for grades 9, 10, 11 and 12.)

SOCIAL STUDIES

United States History (DSS 850) – Grade 7 & 8

\$150.00 Includes United States History through the Civil War, the founding and structure of government, and the rights and responsibilities of individuals.

9th Grade World History (SOC 101) – Grade 9

(½ Credit) -- \$200.00 Includes regional studies in Latin American studies, Middle Eastern studies, Southeast Asia studies, culture and geography.

10th Grade World History (SOC 202) – Grade 10

(½ Credit) -- \$200.00 Includes studies of international conflicts, challenges to democracy and human rights, and the emergence and development of new nations.

United States History (SOC 302) – Grade 11

(½ Credit) -- \$200.00 Includes studies of the United States from the post-Civil War era to the present.

Senior Social Studies – Government, Economics & Global Issues (SOC 422) – Grade 12

(½ Credit) -- \$200.00 Includes studies on civics, economics and contemporary world issues.
