

NEW MEADOWDALE MIDDLE SCHOOL

Q & A

- **When will construction start?**

Construction is expected to start late in the summer of 2009.

- **When will the new school be ready?**

The entire building will be complete by September 2011. The new gym will be constructed first and will be used while the rest of the building is being built. Some site work, such as the baseball field and some of the parking, may be completed in the Fall of 2011.

- **Where will the new building be located?**

Please see the attached site plan. The new building will be constructed to the west of the existing main building. It will extend from about the location of the current gym out into the existing baseball field.

- **What will it look like?**

It will be a two story building and will have a smaller footprint than the current single-story buildings.

- **Where will the students attend school during construction?**

Students will go to classes in the existing buildings. The technology shop will be demolished early in the construction process to allow building the new gym. When the new gym is complete, it will be used while the current gym/music building is demolished.

- **How is this project being funded?**

This project was approved by the voters as part of the 2006 Bond measure, which is also funding the new Lynnwood High School, and other facilities improvements. The District will be applying for State construction matching funds as well.

- **What are the traffic impacts of this project after the new school is open?**

This project will not increase enrollment, and will not increase the volume of traffic. All traffic to the site will be directed to an entrance on 168th Avenue, near Olympic View Drive. The current Olympic View Drive exit will be restricted to maintenance and emergency vehicles.

- **What "Green Buildings" features will the new facility have?**

The new Meadowdale MS will comply with the Washington Sustainable Schools Protocol, which has standards for energy efficiency, indoor air quality, water conservation, recycling and other environmental concerns. The District and its design team are in the process of identifying the specifics of the sustainable features of the project.
