We will have soapstone carving in March, Inuit artist Tukuluk, will be the instructor for this amazing opportunity. Tukuluk has taught this class for the Indian Education Program some years ago. Tukuluk has also taught this class throughout the Edmonds School District, and Edmonds Community College.

If your child is interested in participating in this class, you will have to contact me no later than February 29, 2008 at 4:00 pm. Anytime after that will cost \$15.00 per student. If you are an adult and want to participate the cost is \$15.00 dollars, only students who are enrolled in this program will be exempt from cost. Also any child under nine years of age must have full parental supervision, no exceptions. I can be contacted by email or telephone, and address for the art class is above on the letterhead.

We are look forward to having Tukuluk as our master artist for his time and commitment to the arts. The schedule as follows:
