Financial Grant Program

Each year, the Washington State PTA awards a limited number of financial grants to graduates from Washington State public high schools beginning their freshman year of post-secondary education.

- For the 2007-2008 academic year, grants of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) will be given to recipients entering four-year post-secondary institutions.
- One thousand (\$1,000) dollar grants will be awarded for community colleges, voc-tech schools or other accredited institutions. Washington State PTA grants are awarded on the basis of:
 - 1) financial need
 - 2) academic performance
 - 3) community service

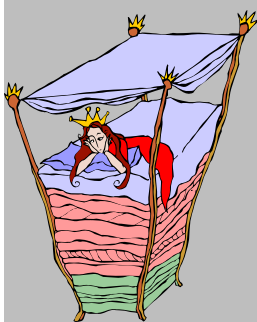

Watch out for the dreaded “senioritis!” It is important for you to continue working hard in classes. You don’t want graduation to be in jeopardy and colleges want to see a strong finish! **Be sure to check your credits and make sure you’re on track to graduate or make plans to finish up in the summer.**

Community and Technical Colleges

- Applications are being accepted for fall enrollment at community and technical colleges.

It is wise to visit the colleges in person, but you may apply online. All of the colleges have informational websites and financial aid services. **Don’t forget to apply for scholarships and complete the FAFSA.**

4-year Colleges and Universities

Here is a quick check list of tasks that need to be accomplished.

- Mid-year reports and transcripts have been sent out if you’ve requested them
- If you have not already done so, submit completed FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) as soon as possible. You may do this online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- Even if you have already been accepted, keep those grades up! Final transcripts will be mailed in June and it is not unheard of for colleges to rescind offers when they see a poor performance for 2nd semester.
- If you’ve been accepted somewhere, please come to the counseling office and tell us!

Binge Drinking among Washington Teens

In the state of Washington, binge drinking on a regular basis – having 5 or more drinks in a row - is reported by 5% of 6th graders, 15% of 8th graders, 23% of sophomores and 32% of seniors.

Binge drinking increases the many risks already inherent in adolescent alcohol use. There are strong connections between binge drinking and alcohol-related injuries, unplanned pregnancy, transmission of sexually transmitted diseases including HIV, and acquaintance rape.

Drinking too much, too fast can also cause alcohol poisoning. The signs of alcohol poisoning include throwing up, passing out and problems with breathing. In extreme cases, the lungs or heart will stop working. People can go into a coma and even die from alcohol poisoning.

Despite these negative consequences, many Washington teens do not perceive much risk or harm associated with binge drinking. When asked "how much do you think people risk harming themselves if they have five or more drinks once or twice each weekend", almost twenty percent of all 6th, 8th, 10th and 12th graders responded "no risk" or "slight risk".

Perceptions of risk of harmfulness, as well as disapproval of use are among the most important determinants of alcohol (and drug) use. Parents can play a critical role in exerting influence on the drinking behavior of their teens. Communicate the harmful risks of alcohol use and how those risks increase with binge drinking. Set clear expectations around no alcohol use and communicate those expectations on a regular basis. And finally, practice good supervision and be involved in your children's lives. When these things happen, youth are more likely to see alcohol use as harmful, less likely to initiate alcohol use early and to misuse alcohol in their later adolescent years.
