
FROM THE DESK OF PRINCIPAL DAVE GOLDEN

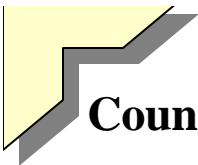
If your student is absent you must call the Attendance Office within 48 hours of the absence to excuse the absence.

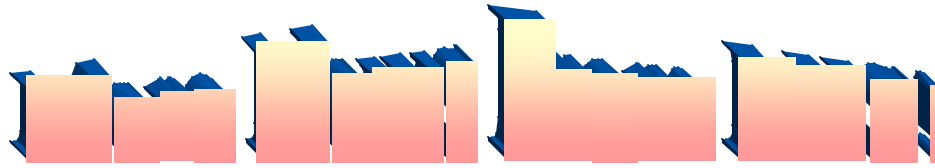

RSVP PROGRAM LOOKING FOR STUDENT VOLUNTEERS

Volunteerism has always been a way for individuals to give back to their community. LHS students have embraced this idea wholeheartedly with the Royals Student Volunteer Program (RSVP). This program places LHS student volunteers at various elementary schools including Hazelwood Elementary, Hilltop Elementary, Lynnwood Intermediate, Martha Lake Elementary, Oak Heights Elementary and Spruce Elementary. At the end of their school day, LHS students board buses or drive their own cars to their volunteer school to spend another hour or two, several times a week, working with younger students. The work done by the LHS volunteers range from one-on-one tutoring in the classroom to helping with after school activity programs. Students will have the possibility of earning .5 volunteer credit with completion of 90 hours of volunteering; the student is also able to include this valuable volunteer experience on college applications and resumes. DRIVER ALERT!!!



In an effort to ensure student safety, the back gate by the greenhouse is to be used solely as an exit for vehicles 45 minutes before the school day and 45 minutes at the end of the day. A sign is posted at this exit specifically prohibiting entrance via this route from 6:45am-7:30am and 1:30pm-2:15pm. During this time, our busses are unloading and loading students in this area and exiting the back gate. Please enter the campus via the main gate on 184th Street to pick up and drop your students off in front of the building. We appreciate the cooperation of both students and parents in maintaining student safety at LHS.

DRUG FREE!!

We are very proud of the change in culture and reputation that Lynnwood High School has undergone over the last few years. We are trying hard to destroy the old reputation as a "tough school" and replace it with the reality of an academically challenging school. As part of this change, we have been getting tougher in our efforts to keep drugs off our campus. Our next step in this direction will be the use of a contraband detection canine from a private company for occasional "walk-throughs" of our parking lot and campus. This newsletter will serve as a notice to you and your son/daughter that this will happen in the near future. We will continue to work on combating teenage drug use with education, counseling and this tough enforcement policy. We believe that this balanced approach will continue to improve our school.

CLASS OF 2009 GRAD NIGHT

The all night graduation party is a long standing tradition at LHS, and one that students look forward to. This is a safe, fun, and memorable event. The Class of 2009 Parent Committee is offering SMART PAY - a voucher system that allows parents/students to pre-pay for their Grad Night ticket. The current price for the tickets is \$150.00. With the voucher system, you can choose to pay the ticket price with one of the following:

1. 3 payments of \$50, beginning in 2006-07; payment due by June 1 of 2007, with 2 additional payments of \$50 due by June 1, 2008.
2. 2 payments of \$75, beginning in 2006-07; payment due by June 1, 2007, with 1 additional payment of \$75 to be paid by June 1, 2008.
3. 1 payment of \$150, payable no later than June 1, 2008 (Junior Year)

None of the voucher ticket options carry over until the Senior Year, as the ticket price will increase at that time.

If you are unsure of your student's willingness, availability, or graduation status, your SMART PAY will be refunded, less a 20% handling fee. All monies collected are held in the LHS/PTSA restricted funds. Complete the form on the right and submit with your check payable to: LHS/PTSA Class of 2009. CONTRACTED LEARNING (CLIP)

SENIORS, the time to apply is NOW! CLIP is an independent study program (with a \$10 fee) for self-directed students who are academically able and motivated to earn a high school diploma. The purpose of CLIP is to enable students to complete course work at an accelerated pace according to each student's schedule and learning needs. CLIP students must indicate a sincere desire to work hard in order to benefit from the program. **ENROLLMENT is LIMITED.** A reading diagnostic test, or a copy of WASL test results reflecting a passing grade for the reading test, is required for all applying students. The reading test is offered during tutorial (7:00 am) on Fridays in room 22. Students must be in room 22 by 7:10am, at the latest, to be allowed to take the test that day. Copies of the WASL results can be brought to room 22 at any time to be added to the wait-list for second semester.
