## Classes of 2010–2012 WASL Graduation Requirements

### Reading and Writing:

Pass the Reading and Writing WASL  
 or DAW for eligible learning support students  
 or WA state approved alternative (see below)

### Math:

Pass the Math WASL  
 or DAW for eligible learning support students  
 or a state approved alternative (see below)  
 or earn 2.0 math or math equivalency\* credits after 10<sup>th</sup> grade and take the math WASL in grade 11 and grade 12.  
 \* Refer to Equivalency List

### State Approved Alternatives for WASL Reading, Writing and Math:

- Collection of Evidence** - Students compile a set of classroom work samples with the help of a teacher(s). The state scores collections two times a year. At MTHS students may take COE classes; see an administrator for details.
- SAT or ACT** - Students may submit scores to the state. Students who have taken the WASL at least once may take the SAT or ACT free of charge. See your counselor for the appropriate paperwork.

- Advanced Placement** students may use a score of three or higher on certain AP courses. See your counselor for details.
- WASL/Grade Comparison** - A student's grades in math and/or English courses are compared with grades of students who took the same courses and passed the WASL. This option is only available to students in grade 12. To access this option, a student must have an accumulative GPA of at least 3.2

### WASL Credit

Through successful completion of the WASL students may earn a .5 credit in English 9 or 10, Algebra 1 or Geometry, and Biology or Physical Science if they have failed a semester of any of those courses. No more than .5 credit will be granted in each discipline. The same applies for students whose Collection of Evidence meets standard.

### BEING ON TRACK FOR GRADUATION

*To be on track for graduation, a student must earn a minimum number of credits.* The following chart explains the minimum credits to be earned by the end of each semester, by grade level, in order for your student to be on track for graduation:

<i>Grade</i>	<i>Min. Credits Sem. 1</i>	<i>Min. Credits Sem. 2</i>
Freshman	2	5
Sophomore	7	10
Junior	13	16
Please note that a would-be senior who earns fifteen (15) credits by the start of the school year may petition for senior status by completing a contract detailing a plan to earn all credits and requirements needed by graduation.
