The key to the future...

Scriber Lake High School has the same graduation requirements as other high schools in the Edmonds School District and students earn an Edmonds School District diploma. In addition to regular courses taught in smaller classes, we offer integrated courses such as:

- **Close Up** combines US History, English, and American Government. The course focuses on citizens’ role in government. This course includes a week-long experience in Washington D. C. where students from Scriber interact with students from all over the country.
- **INSTEP** (Interdisciplinary Studies Environmental Program) - a class that combines Science, English, Art, Health and P.E. to explore the environment and ecology of the Pacific Northwest.
- **Leadership** By engaging in analysis of leadership, culture, relationship building tools, students will be empowered to become a leader in school, community and larger society, to take charge and make change.
- **Environmental Science** This is a class in which students are able to earn credit in Math and Science while exploring the northwest and the responsibility of each person in relation to the environment.
- **ENTRY**—a program for all new students at Scriber. Entry works on study skills, self-esteem, teamwork, and motivation for school, combining English, Art, Health and Elective credit.
- **Vocational Training**—access to programs such as Carpentry, Culinary Arts, Auto Shop, Careers with Children, Fire Service through **Edmonds School District Intra-District programs, Sno-Isle Skills Center, and Workforce Development.**
