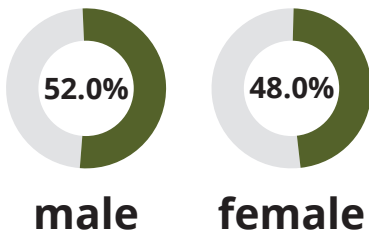

State Assessments

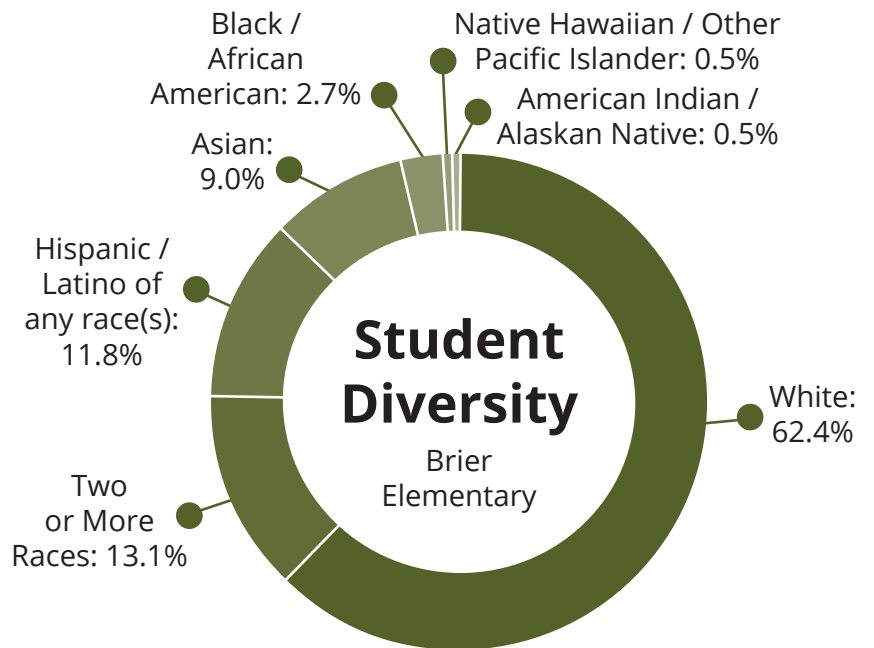
Washington students are tested annually by the state to assess their progress as they move through school. In grades 3-8 students take tests in English language arts, math and science. Please see [our School Report Card](#).



Academic Accomplishments and Goals – Focus Areas

Through our Cycle of Inquiry, SBA measurements, learning walks and attendance outreach, we saw some overall improvements this past year but there is still an achievement gap between our English Language Learners and their non-English Language Learner peers. Based on these data, we will continue to further our work in addressing this gap. Therefore, in 2019-2020, Brier Elementary will continue working together to develop and implement intentional, strategic lesson planning in literacy and math that utilizes best teaching practices that reach all learners, specifically targeting students who are English Language Learners. 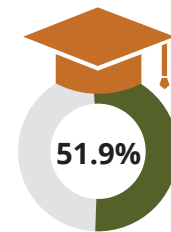
