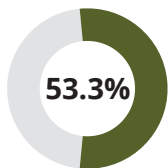

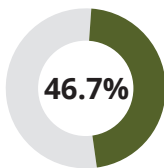


State Assessments

Academic Accomplishments and Goals – Focus Areas

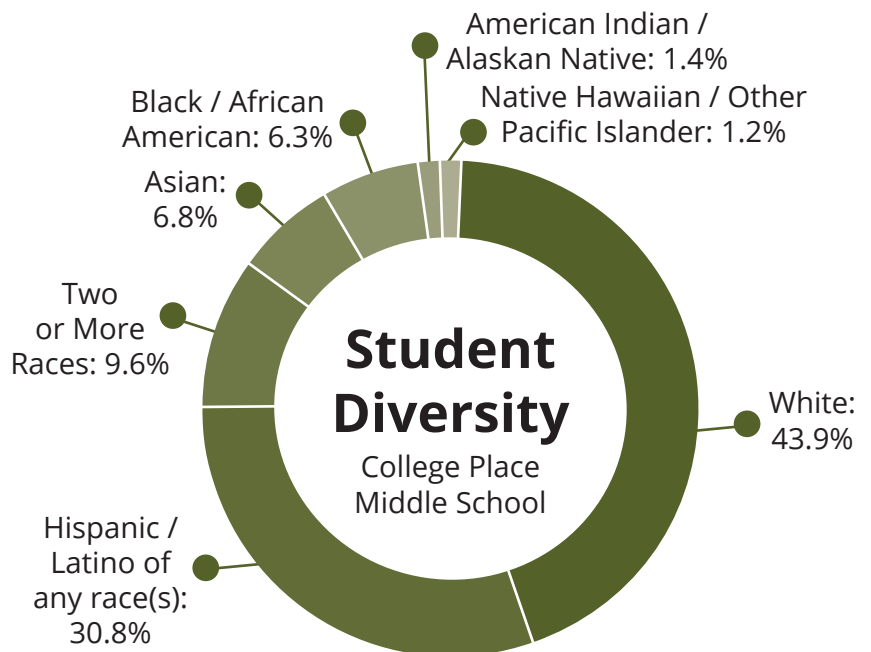
IF College Place Middle School staff effectively establishes, fosters and manages a safe, positive learning environment by:

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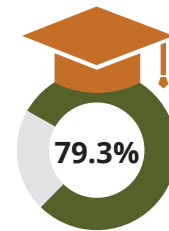
- Staff will acknowledge and honor students' individual cultures and experiences so that students will feel comfortable taking intellectual risks.
