## About Us

The Edmonds eLearning Academy is an online learning community that serves any Edmonds School District student in grades 7-12. The majority of our students are part-time or blended, meaning they take one or two classes with us and the rest at their traditional school. We have over 100 full-time students for whom we provide all of their educational needs. Our school and classes are free if a student takes a course within their regular six-period day.

What sets us apart from other online schools? We have an on-site Student Learning Center where students can receive help from Edmonds School District certified teachers. The Student Learning Center and our success with students gave us the distinction of one of the Top 10 Alternative Learning Experience (A.L.E.) Schools in the state of Washington. Last year, 1 in 6 graduates of the Edmonds School District had taken an eLearning course and we expect that number to continue to grow.


## Our 99 students at a glance:


### Academic Accomplishments and Goals – Focus Areas

Edmonds eLearning Academy (EeLA) is one of the few fully accredited, public, online schools in the state of Washington. As a school, we are available to 7th through 12th-grade students in the district. Students can choose to come to EeLA either as a full-time student or as a part-time student shared with their home school.

- EeLA students are able to accelerate their course-pacing and learning potential, leading to the ability to earn credits at a faster pace and meet state and district learning and graduation requirements.
- EeLA teachers:
  - Customize courses to differentiate and meet the needs of diverse learners,

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


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- Create a culture of learning by conveying an expectation of high levels of student effort and by demonstrating a high regard for students' abilities,
- Work with students in the Student Learning Center to support them in meeting their academic goals and managing their time, as well as practicing self-advocacy,
- Provide focused feedback to enrich student understanding of, and engagement with, the curriculum. Another benefit of providing individualized feedback in an online environment such as ours is to create and build relationships.
- Utilizing our Tiered Academic Intervention system, EeLA is committed to increasing course completion rates at each grade level.
- EeLA staff implement trauma-informed practices by utilizing a social-emotional team to support students of concern and develop individualized interventions.
