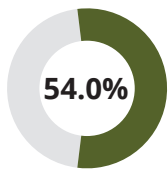

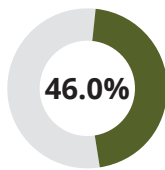


State Assessments

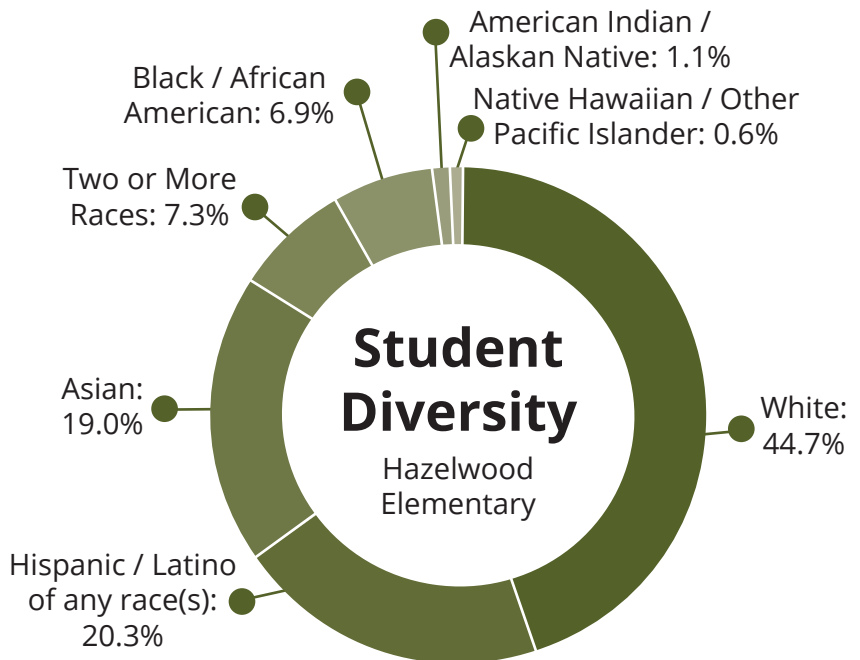


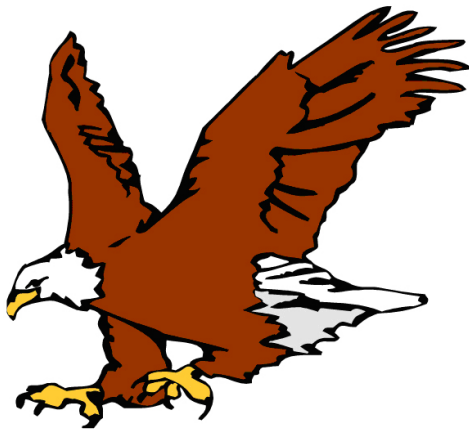

Academic Accomplishments and Goals – Focus Areas

Through our Cycle of Inquiry, SBA measurements, and data analysis, we recognize there is still an achievement gap between our students with IEPs and our students without IEPs. Based on staff surveys, attendance reports, and the District Family Survey, we will work to address this gap. Therefore, in 2019-2020, Hazelwood leadership and staff will collaborate to identify and remove barriers for student learning by implementing schoolwide systems; SEL behavior strategies; and facilitating an inclusive, safe culture so that students will be able to focus on learning content. achievement of all students while narrowing the gap and disproportionality that exists between our highest and lowest performing students.

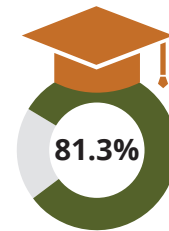
