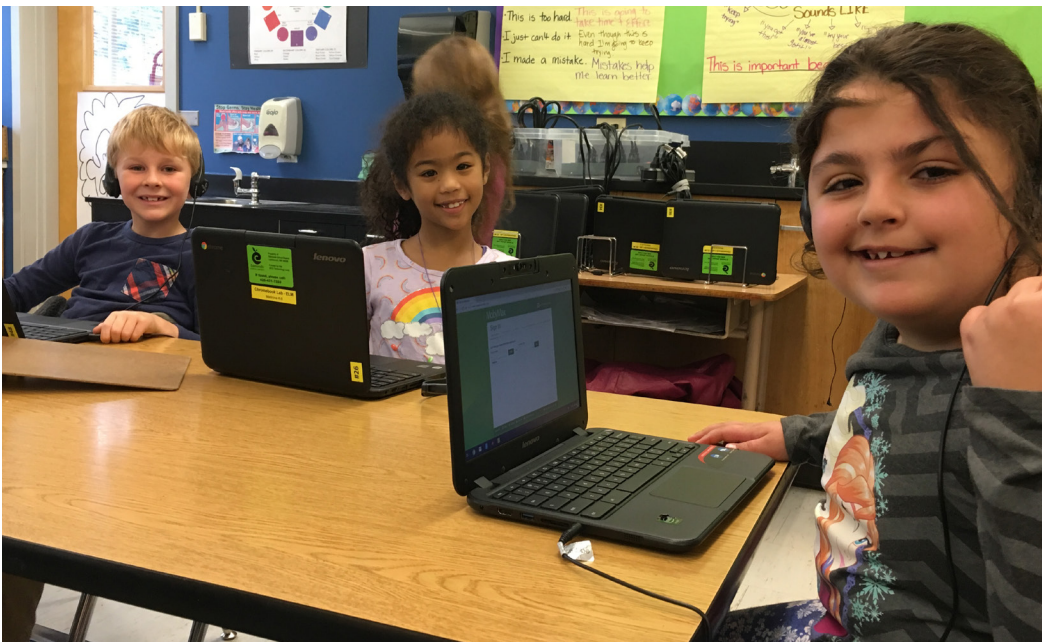


Madrona K-8 School

Mission Statement of School and District

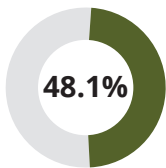

Our 607 students at a glance:

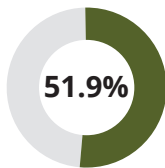


State Assessments

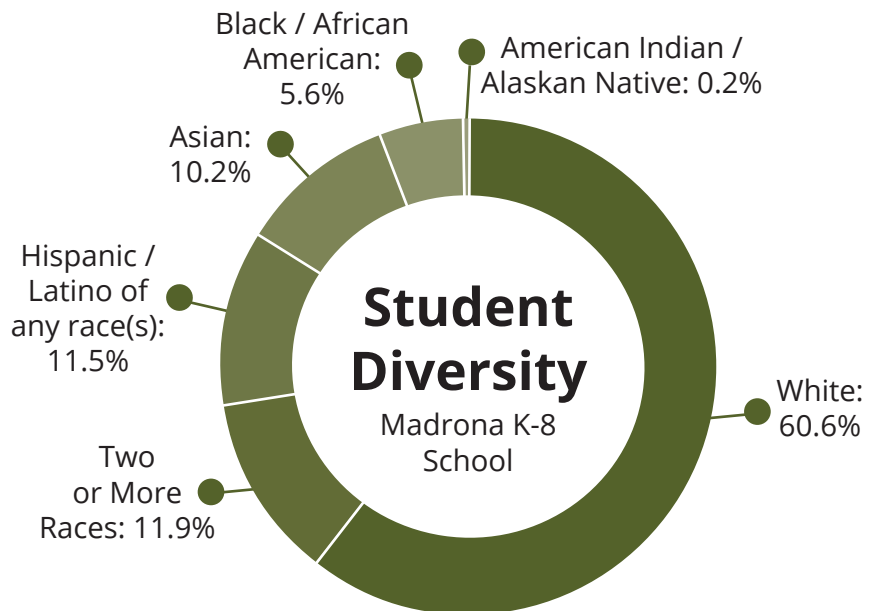

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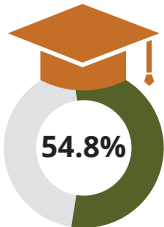
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How You Can Help
