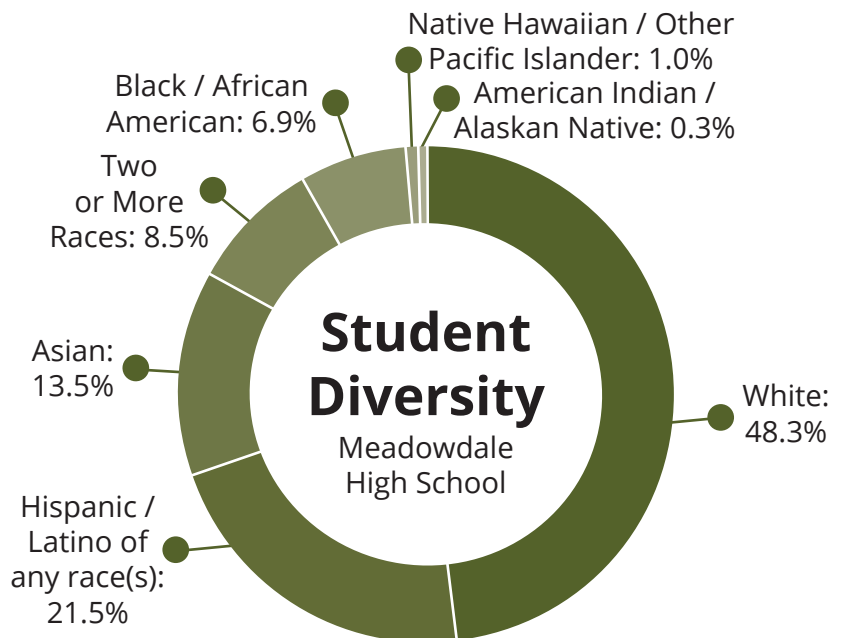
Academic Accomplishments and Goals – Focus Areas

1. Expand strategies to provide/improve quality instruction for all students.

- We will focus professional development on creating engaging lessons, differentiation, and culturally responsive practices. We will maintain a safe and respectful learning environment for all students while encouraging them to be active members of the MDHS community.
- Teachers will develop specific targeted interventions based on data from classroom based assessments, students will then receive the support they need in order to master the standards in their classes.

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- Teachers will further develop strategies to build relationships with all students. If this is done, then students will feel more connected and engaged in school and be more academically successful.

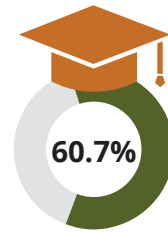
3. Improve PLC practices.
