


State Assessments



Academic Accomplishments and Goals – Focus Areas

We, as staff, students, and community, continue to be committed to providing a quality education to ALL students. We believe all students need to be known, cared for and held to high expectations. Through intentional efforts focusing on kindergarten and first grade reading, we had a significant increase in students meeting standards as measured by Acadience and Independent Reading Levels before the pandemic. In 2018, we had a growth in the percent of students meeting grade level standards in ELA and math, but continue to strive for a higher percentage of students meeting grade level standards. We continue to have a gap between the percentage of our students receiving EL services and our non EL learners passing both reading and math. During the pandemic, many of our students' reading levels stayed stagnant or decreased, as measured by our March to September Independent Reading Levels. Overcoming these setbacks in

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students reaching grade level standard in reading is our area of focus this year. For the 2020-2021 school year, we have implemented standardized on line systems, offered increased live learning sessions and rigorous learning activities for students. We are making intentional and strategic efforts to communicate, partner and assist with our non-English speaking families. We believe that if we as a staff increase our partnership with families and students, we will increase access to students and student engagement.

Additionally, we have implemented a new reading curriculum, and have aligned all grade levels with the common goal of increasing students' reading achievement through Professional Learning Communities and focused Student Growth Goals.


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How You Can Help
