

Academic Accomplishments and Goals – Focus Areas

We stated in our goal that we would decrease the percentage of students below standard in math by 10%. Our goal was to have 53% of our students at standard in math. In 2018-19 school year we had 54% of our students at standard exceeding our goal. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19, students did not take the Smarter Balance Assessment (SBA) last year therefore we were unable to see if we continued to progress in our goal.

We continued our work from the previous year focusing on engaging our students in math and increasing opportunities for students to take the IBA's. We also added a layer of inquiry around vocabulary and places a focus on explicitly identifying and teaching tier two vocabulary in math. Along with these additions we also piloted the iReady math in fifth and sixth grade. We saw tremendous results from the program and unanimously agreed to implement iReady school wide in both reading and math.

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In 2020-21 we will use assessment tools in instruction when providing students with a variety of tasks. We want our students to engage in content learning, grounded in evidence, to increase their ability to engage in mathematics, reading, writing, and speaking. We will continue to learn and apply strategies to better engage our students as well as build strong school to home connections with all of our families. The iReady platform provides us with valuable data and helps staff design targeted interventions that address gaps in learning. The iReady program also designs a supplemental learning program that provides interventions and proactive support for students. We are excited to see how the combination of teacher instruction coupled with this valuable data and the learning path work together to improve student achievement in the area of math.


