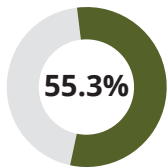

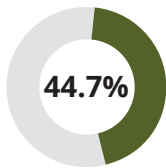


## State Assessments

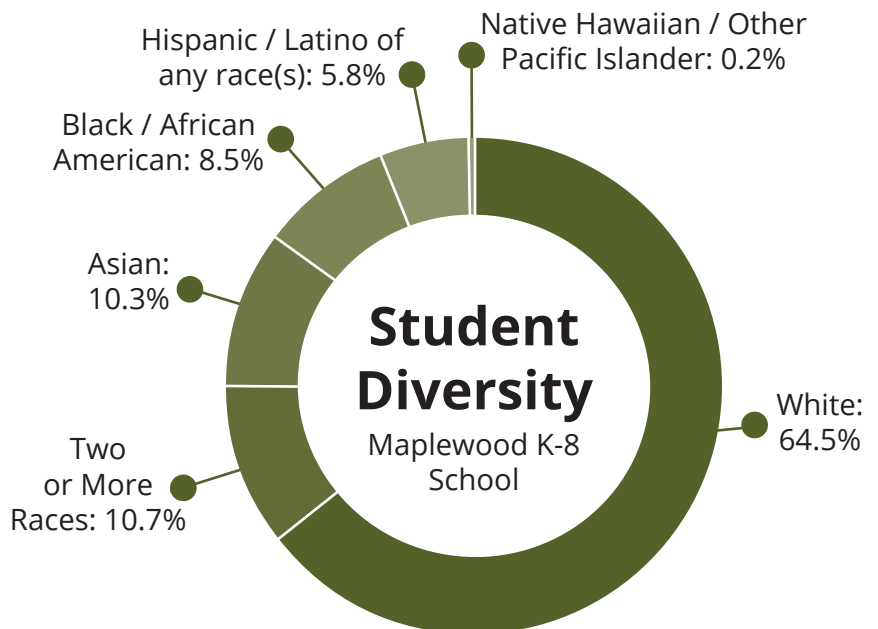

We believe that improving relationships with students when implementing guaranteed and viable curriculum with academic mindset, engagement and rigor will improve students' abilities to make progress in citing evidence using alternative and augmentative communication, verbal responses and in writing to support opinions and/or ideas (research/inquiry target 4). Students will show improvement in their abilities to draw evidence from literary or informational texts to support analysis, reflection and research (College & Career Readiness Standard for Writing: Research to Build and Present Knowledge 9, pg. 18) as measured by universal formative and summative assessments.

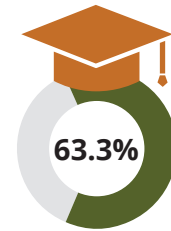
