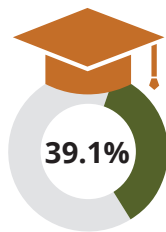

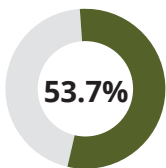
## Our 203 students at a glance:



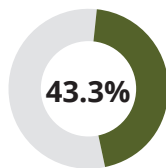
## 4-year graduation rate, Class of 2019

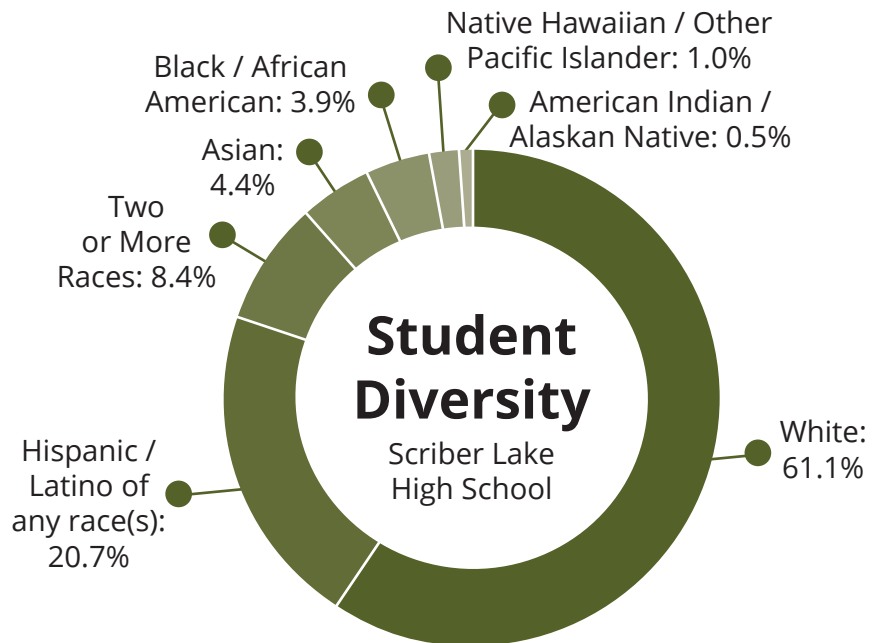

- Teachers, intentional about embedding

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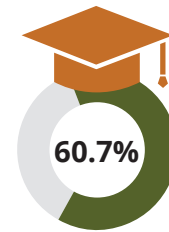
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- effective strategies in lessons for all their students.
