### Q: WHEN WILL ATTENDANCE BE RECORDED?

Teachers will record daily attendance when there are planned instructional activities, including but not limited to: daily logins, daily interaction with teachers, or evidence of participation in an task or assignments.




### Q: WHAT IS CONSIDRED AN EXCUSED ABSENCE?



The list of reasons for absences to be excused was expanded to create flexibility for families. 




## Q: WILL I BE NOTIFIED IF MY STUDENT IS NOT ENGAGING IN ONLINE LEARNING?

Yes, Families will continue to receive daily automated calls to inform you that your student has been marked absent. This notification serves as a reminder that your student still has time to complete online work.
