Mission statement of school and district

The Edmonds School District is relentlessly focused on ensuring Equity, Excellence, and Engagement for ALL students.

With our students, staff, families and entire community, we strive to provide high quality teaching and learning to serve ALL kids. We strive to disrupt institutional bias based on race, ethnicity, cultural, linguistic background, or circumstances.

About our school

Cedar Valley Elementary is a large and socially, linguistically and culturally diverse community of learners. Our teachers and staff are committed to providing rich learning opportunities for all students. We shape and nurture our culture and integrate an inclusive approach to schooling where, collaboratively, we are all committed to each child's academic success.

Accomplishments and goals

Accomplishments:

- We supported a strong implementation of intermediate (3-6) social emotional curriculum and a program (Second Step) that consistently supports all students' growth in social-emotional learning and regulation. With this instruction, student "grit" increased from 48% to 52% in the intermediate grades. This includes English learners and students receiving special education services.
- EL's have strong attendance, 3.1% higher than the school average.
- One-third of all new CVE Kindergartners come to the learning community with proficient kinder-readiness skills (per the WaKids Fall assessment).
- Students receiving special education services increased their math proficiency rate from 12% to 12.5%.

Academic goals:

- **Goal 1:** Between Fall of 2021 and Spring of 2024, students who are reading below grade level in grades 1-3 will meet standard, increasing from 54% to 60%, as measured by I-Ready, Running records, and aligned classroom-based assessments.
- **Goal 2:** Between Fall of 2021 and Spring of 2024, students who are below grade level in math within grades 4-6 will meet standard, increasing from 16% to 22%, as measured by I-Ready and SBA and aligned classroom based assessments.
- **Goal 3:** Between Fall of 2021 and Spring of 2024, students in grades 3-6 will feel a greater sense of belonging/supportive relationships at school, increasing from 62% to 66%, as measured by the Panorama General Wellness Survey and other site-based surveys.



Where does our money come from? - Revenue

The district receives funding from three primary sources. The State of Washington provides approximately 71% of the funding for general operating costs, the federal government provides 7%, and 15% is generated through property taxes collected under the voter-approved Educational Programs and Operations Levy. Starting in 2019-20, the District began receiving Federal Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Program funding (ESSER).






