





## **Sustained Academic Growth and Success** Highlights of the 2013-14 school year

he Edmonds School District has realized sustained growth and success for its students for more than a decade. Our students again met or surpassed state percentages in the areas of reading, writing, math and science in the majority of grades on the 2013 state assessments. On the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) - an objective measure of the quality of our system, staff, students and community - our students surpassed the state and national averages in math, reading and writing (see chart page 2).

During the course of the current school year, Superintendent Nick Brossoit has met with and will continue to share with community groups, rotaries, and city councils the 2013-2014 Highlights, and how we are all working to build on this success:

#### **Early Learning**

Since 2009, our District has made a concerted effort to build a pre-kindergarten through third-grade program, partnering with the early childhood community. We are accelerating our efforts to increase student achievement.

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#### More for Your Money: Your Tax **Dollars Working Across the District**

Update on the voter-approved 2008 and 2012 Technology/Capital Levies

As a result of careful planning and other factors, additional needed projects will be completed throughout 2014 across the District. Most notably, the fascia at Edmonds Elementary will be replaced this summer.

"Funds from the 2008 Technology/Capital Levy remain available to complete work beyond the safety and health priority projects," said Stewart Mhyre, Executive Director of Business and Operations. "Thanks to fiscally strong management of the funds approved by our taxpayers, improving the exterior of Edmonds Elementary will take place during the summer of 2014 and has been a request of community members and families for quite some time."

Other summer 2014 projects include: roof replacement at Oak Heights Elementary and gutter/downspout replacement at Chase Lake Community School.

The voter-approved 2012 Technology/Capital Levy is continuing to provide our students with an opportunity to have access to technology tools that will assist in their learning and help them be prepared for the technology competency needed to graduate career and college ready. Through the funds we replace older equipment and continue to infuse new techniques, programs and equipment as needed into our schools.

Current projects at various schools include energy efficiency upgrades to lighting, heating/ventilation and boiler systems and teacher instructional laptop, projector and document camera replacements.

## Message from the Superintendent

#### Dear Community,

As you may recall from the information we sent you in November, 2013, the District is holding an election Tuesday, February 11, 2014, with two important measures on the ballot; 1) a

Replacement School Programs and Operation Levy and, 2) a Capital Construction Bond.

The School Programs and Operation Levy represents 23 percent of our District's daily operating revenue. These funds allow the District to provide local support for: teachers to keep class sizes smaller; paraeducators and staff who support the educational program; books and instructional materials; transportation and safe student travel; athletics, music and drama; co-curricular activities; services for special needs students; support staff for programs, services and technology; training, utilities and insurance. This levy will replace the current levy which ends in 2014. This is not an additional or new tax levy.

Communities have local levies because people want their local schools to provide better programs and services than what is possible when only funded by the state. In order to continue at our present level of programs and services, the law requires that our current replacement levy be renewed

#### Reducing Class Size; Adding Full-Day Kindergarten

More than 600 students started free, full-day kindergarten this school year through additional state funding. Also expected are additional funds to provide teachers to reduce class size in grades 1-3 thanks to the Supreme Court victory ordering the state to fully fund public education by 2018.

#### **New Teacher-Principal Evaluation System**

Put into place for the 2013-14 school year, the new system is designed to better support student learning in the classroom through quality teaching and instructional leadership.

#### **Closing the Achievement Gap**

We are continuing to remove barriers, create a supportive culture and use student data properly to support what's best for students, families and staff.

#### **Student Learning: Common Core State Standards**

District leaders, principals and teachers are working to put into place these new standards with the goal that effective student learning is meaningful, relevant and exciting.

by voters. Washington State will have to invest more into K-12 education as a result of the McCleary case and the Supreme Court order to fully fund education; however, this funding will take years to realize and the local replacement levy is still necessary for local support of schools.


Approval of the Capital Construction Bond would allow the District to improve safety, upgrade heating/ventilation, replace roofs, enhance energy efficiencies and other capital improvements, reduce class size grades 1-6 at various schools; add classrooms for full-day kindergarten; modernize Spruce, Lynnwood and Mountlake Terrace elementary schools; add classroom capacity at Edmonds-Woodway High; relocate/replace Alderwood Middle School; replace Lynndale Elementary and Madrona School; and relocate/replace the Maintenance/Transportation/ Warehouse facility.

Some of the capital projects included in this Bond proposal represent years of work by the Citizens Planning Committee (CPC) and District staff and were identified as early as 2005 as needing to be completed. The projects were selected based on objective criteria and established through this comprehensive and extensive process. Adding classrooms to reduce class size in grades 1-6 and providing additional classrooms for full-day Kindergarten is the result of the State providing additional funding for classroom teachers. The state funding cannot be used to construct or provide the additional space needed across the majority of the District's 22 elementary schools.

The District can stabilize the overall rate paid by taxpayers by managing the timing of the sale of the bonds and the work/projects. If approved, the approximate cost of the Capital Construction Bond to a house valued at \$300,000 would be just under \$12.00 per month. Please see Overall Tax Impact chart below.

To further our capital projects work and continue to be good stewards of public resources, we are still working to use surplus District properties to provide revenue either through sale or lease. Revenue from these surplus properties will help, but does not come close to meeting the capital projects needs in the District. Therefore, the bond proposition on this February ballot is necessary to do the work we have identified. During the long recession, our property values dropped just as those in the private sector. Now that the economy is turning around there is renewed interest from developers. Exactly when and how much revenue all the available surplus properties generate we do not know at this time; however, we cannot wait to complete necessary and timely capital project work.







## **Be an Early Bird!** Register for Kindergarten 2014-15



Children who will be 5-years-old by August 31, 2014 are eligible to begin kindergarten in September.Registration continues through June 27 and then again beginning August 11 at all schools. Please register by March 7 if you are interested in entering the lottery for the full-time program at your school.

### **Bring Required Documents to Register:**

- Certified Birth Certificate
- Vaccinations and Immunization Record
- Proof of Residency (utility bill, lease, or mortgage papers).

Please start the process even if you do not have the birth certificate or immunizations.

### **Program Options:**

- Part-Time Kindergarten: 5 days a week, morning or afternoon session. There is no charge to parents.
- Full-Time Kindergarten: 5 days a week, full school day. Tuition for 2014-2015 will be \$3,600. Tuition waivers may also be available to qualifying families (as funding permits).
